## Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 4C – September 2021 Quarter

### SUMMARY

- A negative cash flow of \$4.6m from underlying operating activities was recorded for the Q1 FY2022 quarter, principally driven by:
  - an additional fortnight of wages during the quarter, over and above the June 2021 quarter, amounting to an incremental \$5.7m cost;
  - employee entitlements of \$1.0m paid to staff during the quarter on the completion of the QIC Ltd contract; and
  - favorable timing of debtor collections in late June 2021 that contributed to the strong June 2021 quarter cash collections (but reduced the amount available for collection in the September 2021 quarter);
- \$13.8m of unused facilities available as at September 2021 quarter end. Cash on hand as at 30 September 2021 was \$3.8m resulting in total available funding \$17.6m.

### Quarterly Activities

There were no material changes in the principal activities within the Company's Cleaning and Security segments during the quarter ended 30 September 2021 (Q1FY22).

The Group's underlying revenue of \$65.6 million for the 3 months ending 30 September 2021 was \$3.6m or 5.2% lower compared to revenue of \$69.2m in the June 2021 quarter (Q4FY22). The decline in total underlying revenue was a result of:

- a reduction in contract revenue of \$4.1m primarily due to the extended COVID-19 lockdown periods in NSW, Victoria and New Zealand in Q1FY22 compared to minimal lockdowns in Q4FY21.
- the completion of the QIC Ltd contract part way through the September 2021 month.

Pleasingly, the contract revenue reduction was partially offset by a \$0.5m increase in the more profitable ad hoc revenue.

- Wages and other benefits of \$80,392 paid to Mr Stephen Lidbury, a substantial shareholder of the Company, in his capacity of General Manager of Security. Office rent including adjustments of \$23,282 was paid in the current quarter on normal commercial terms to an entity related to Mr Stephen Lidbury;
- Consulting fees of \$93,000 were paid to Wayne and Eileen Crewes Pty Ltd, a substantial shareholder of the Company;
- Wages and other benefits of \$30,187 were paid to a close family member of the controller of Wayne and Eileen Crewes Pty Ltd, in the associate's capacity as an employee of the Group;
- Consulting fees of \$90,000 were paid to Jungle Capital Pty Ltd, an entity that Mr Stuart Grimshaw, the Company's Chairman, has a minority interest in, for corporate and strategic advisory services.
